Anyone can attend Parish Council meetings and whilst non-councillors are not able actively to take part during the conducting of Council business, we very much appreciate your contributions during the public participation item. In Swanbourne this often involves fun and lively discussion as well as update. Community input and feedback is critical to how we operate so please do come along if you would like to.

The Parish Assembly is an exceptional example – all of our community is invited to join us to catch up with what the Parish Council has been doing, explain how the precept is being spent and talk about plans for the next year. Updates and News

- Coronation Weekend
- Swanbourne did His Majesty proud it really was a Happy & Glorious weekend.

• Traffic Issues – SPEEDING, Pavements & Verges

- Speeding continues to be a cause of significant concern; we have heard several reports of frightening 'near miss' accidents as a result of speeding vehicles and inconsiderate driving.
- To strengthen our case for action towards, and funding for traffic calming we are investigating means of collecting traffic data (anonymous). Watch this space.
- Cllr Phil Gomm is working with us on this and is confident that a traffic calming scheme will be forthcoming and will have a very significant and positive impact.
- We remain hopeful that this will not take long.
- Please leave pavements clear of bins, or cars or anything else so that we can all use them safely whether we are a pedestrian, have a dog or pushchair or use a wheelchair/mobility scooter.
- Cars churn up grass verges in particular when the weather has been wet; please use the road for turning or parking.

• Potholes

- The potholes are still awful.
- As you know they fall outside Parish Council remit, but we are continuing to monitor the situation, to report new damage and to do all we can to speed the repair process.

- The older device that was previously located outside the Village Hall is out of order and temporarily decommissioned.
- When it is back in action the second defibrillator will be located outside the school to ensure geographical cover for the whole village. We will keep you posted.



Conservation - Save the British Bluebell



May is a beautiful time of the year for seeing bluebells but somehow those garden centre bluebells don't seem to have the same magic that you see with a carpet of bluebells in our native woodlands. That's because most garden centre bluebells belong to a different subspecies – the Spanish bluebell – which has bigger flowers on twiggy, taller stems with no scent. Garden centres sell Spanish bluebells simply because their flowers are bigger. There's no other reason. English bluebells are smaller with a nodding stem and have a stronger blue colour compared with the Spanish subspecies. As the Spanish type becomes more widespread, they are hybridising with the native bluebells and changing their form. Most bluebells in Swanbourne are Spanish or hybrids. Refuse to buy Spanish invaders – order English bluebells online instead!
